Summer landscape Tips: As the temperatures warm up weeds start to sprout. To prevent weeds in your yard it is important to apply a pre-emergent to grass and rocks. This prevents any new weed seedlings from sprouting. Spray a post-emergent on any current weeds to kill the root, then remove the weed.

June is the month palm trees start to bloom. It is important to trim the blooms and remove any dead palm frawns. This prevents any seeds from spreading to neighboring properties and creating volunteer palms, or cause chemical imbalances in neighboring pools.

If you want a lush green lawn, aerate the soil and apply a time release fertilizer. This allows the hard compacted soil to breathe and allow new growth. The fertilizer helps promote new growth, and results in a vibrant green lawn.

Community Reminders

Architectural Request Application: If you are planning any architectural changes of your home, please remember; "No building, improvements, alterations, repairs, rebuilding, excavation, grading, landscaping or other work which in any way temporarily or permanently alters the exterior appearance of any of the Property" requires prior written approval by the Architectural Committee. Architectural Change Applications are available at Metro Property Services. Trash Recycle Containers: Trash containers should be out no more than a 24-hour period on collection days (i.e. dusk the day before to dusk the day of pick-up). All containers must be stored from visual sight - behind your gate or in your garage at all other times. As a courtesy to your neighbors, as well as the community in general, please store trash containers out of view.
