Put Simple Steps in Play Save a Child's Life!

- Never leave a child unattended in a pool or spa and always watch your child when he or she is in or near water.
- Keep children away from pool drains, pipes and other openings to avoid entrapments.
- Teach children basic water safety tips
- Have a telephone close by when you or your family is using a pool or spa
- If a child is missing, look for him or her in the pool or spa first
- Learning and Practicing Water Safety Skills.
- ♦ Learn how to swim and teach your child how to swim.
- Learn to perform CPR on children and adults, and update those skills regularly.
- Understand the basics of life-saving so that you can assist in a pool emergency.
- Install a four-foot or taller fence around the pool and spa and use self-closing and self-latching gates; ask your neighbors to do the same at their pools.
- Ensure any pool and spa you use has compliant drain covers, and ask your pool service provider if you do not know.
- Maintain pool and spa covers in good working order.
